Let's talk about the economy. You know jobs.

What has congress done that has affected the economy in a positive way?

How about negative things on the economy?

Oh boy now I can think of lots.

Let's start with the Department of Commerce and our trade agreements. Over the last 50 years, congress has stood idly by and watched as 50 million jobs left the country.

That's right, 50 million jobs. Those jobs were mostly in the manufacturing sector. At the same time we have gradually decreased import tariffs and allowed cheaper goods to flow freely into the United States from countries like China, Korea, Japan, Indonesia, Pakistan, India, and Viet Nam.

Entire cities and communities were wiped out and still the government did nothing. We were told that America needed to compete in the

Large companies have made it clear that they will seek efficiencies wherever they can find them. All in the name of profit. The business model is no different than the manufacturing one started 50 years ago. Cheap labor and minimal benefits.

Microsoft is one such company that has actually laid off American workers and established large shops in India. IBM has done the same thing. I fail to see how anyone can approve of replacing American workers, with low cost foreign counterparts. At this rate, what jobs will be left?

Now let's talk about energy. As a country we are the largest energy user in the world. Oil which has become a world commodity, has become our scarce commodity. We now import over 60% of our daily needs, and it's getting worse.

Every President for the last 30 years has been pledging energy independence, and yet we fall farther and farther behind. It has been said that the United States can't drill our way out of this problem. If that is true, which I have my doubts, then what is the answer?

# You Can We Can

It really comes down to less usage by the American people. We have built a society where we depend heavily on automobiles for transportation. Small changes in habits can make a big difference in our energy consumption. Oil is not in short supply, in fact there is plenty to last us for 60 years into the future.

That being said, the daily production verses daily usage around the world is starting to tighten. This is what could cause short term spikes in price. Something that would be crippling to our economy if it were to last for long periods of time.

In every case where we have had these spikes, Americans have reacted by driving less and conserving. This is not a new phenomena, but it is one that has never been adequately solved. Whenever the consumer gets frustrated enough and it seems as if the people are willing to look at other fuel alternatives, the price of oil magically drops.

I don't believe America needs to expand production dramatically, but any addition to the daily world output, would have a limiting affect on price. The same with usage. A decrease of 1-2 % coupled with an increase in production of 2-5% would have a serious impact on the price per barrel.
